The NYSAFC office stands at the heart of the Association. As it has since 1984, the office provides a home away from home for NYSAFC members and officers, a base for NYSAFC programs, and a place for a wide range of activities run by and for the fire and emergency services community. Its façade and interior spaces are still in good shape, but the NYSAFC building is aging rapidly. Without significant upgrades and renovations, it will continue to decline. At present, for example, the 24-year-old roof is badly in need of replacement. Insulation and ventilation problems have resulted in ice damming and frequent leaks into the building, damaging ceilings and walls. The siding, exterior walls, trim, and flashing are in need of repainting and repair. The building has only one heating zone: the temperature varies drastically from room to room. Electrical systems and wiring must be updated and safety ensured. Original carpeting and curtains are badly worn and need replacement. Parking lot asphalt needs repair and resealing. That is why it is so important to repair and refurbish the building as soon as possible — to guarantee its usefulness well into the new century. In addition to these critical upgrades, which will allow NYSAFC to continue its legacy of leadership well into 2008 and beyond, our office also serves as a meeting place and home to the New York State Volunteer Ambulance and Rescue Association and many local fire and emergency service organizations.

Based on assessment of a professional engineering firm, we've set a Building for the Future capital campaign goal of \$330,000. We need your help.
