In fact, it will happen several times, each with different twists and turns. At a large commercial building, engine crews will stretch big, long lines into the structure. Trucks and squads will force entry, ventilate and do large area searches. The RIT team will prepare for the eventual MAYDAY. Chief officers, monitored by one of the nation's best incident commanders, will help manage the BIG ONE.
